Alves, Mr. Luiz Fernando

Luiz Alves is Head of the Risk Management Unit in the Public Debt Strategic Planning Department of the National Treasury Secretariat of Brazil, where he has been working since 2003. He holds a Master's degree in Economics from the Federal University of Minas Gerais, Brazil.

Al-Shabibi, Dr. Sinan

Sinan Al-Shabibi is the current governor of the Central Bank of Iraq. He has held this position since 2003. He holds a B.Sc. in Economics from Baghdad University (1966), a Diploma in Advanced Studies in Economic Development, an M.A. in Economics from the University of Manchester (1970, 1971), and a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Bristol (1975). He has since held several operational positions in the Bank's Africa, and East Asia and Pacific Regional Vice-Presidencies (including a field assignment in Ethiopia); worked on sovereign debt buyback and restructuring operations in the Co-financing and Financial Advisory Services Vice Presidency; and conducted policy-oriented economic research in the Bank's Development Economics Vice-Presidency. Immediately prior to becoming a Sector Manager at the World Bank in 2008, he was the Bank's Lead Economist for China and Mongolia at its Headquarters in Washington, DC.

Grímsson, H.E. Mr. Ólafur Ragnar

H.E. Ólafur Ragnar Grímsson is President of the Republic of Iceland. Early in his career, Ólafur Ragnar Grímsson began playing a role in public affairs in Iceland. He was a member of the Young Progressives from 1966 to 1973 and was on the executive committee of the Progressive Party in the years 1971-1973. In 1974 Ólafur Ragnar Grímsson stood as a parliamentary candidate for the Liberal-Left Alliance, taking a seat in the Alþingi as a deputy member in 1974 and 1975. He was chairman of the parliamentary group of the People's Alliance from 1980 to 1983 and chairman of its executive committee from 1983 to 1987. He was editor of the newspaper Þjóðviljinn from 1983 to 1985, and was elected Leader of the People's Alliance from 1987-1995. In the years 1988-1991 he was Minister of Finance in a government headed by Steingrímur Hermannsson. Among many international awards he has received is the Indira Gandhi Peace Prize which he received on behalf of PGA. Ólafur Ragnar was a member of the committee of the Peace Initiative of Six Heads of State in the years 1984-1989, and was awarded honorary doctorates by the universities of Ås (Norway) in 1997 and Manchester in 2001. Ólafur Ragnar Grímsson is the author of a large number of academic articles that have appeared in both Icelandic and overseas periodicals.

Haffar El Hassan, H.E. Ms. Raya

H.E. Raya Haffar El Hassan was Minister of Finance in Lebanon from November 2009 to June 2011. Before that, she was a member of the Office of the Prime Minister, where she led a number of projects. Notably, she worked on the elaboration of the government's economic and social reform agenda under the Paris II and Paris III International Donor Conferences. Earlier in her career, Ms. El Hassan was a Programme Specialist for the Economic Governance and Pro-Poor Portfolio at the UNDP Lebanon Country Office and advisor to the Minister of Economy and Trade. In the mid 1990's, and as Implementation Coordinator for the Public Expenditure Management component of a World Bank project, she assisted in the setting up and in the operation of UNCTAD's DMFAS system at the Ministry of Finance. Sammy Khallaf is Advisor adviser to the Finance Minister for public debt management, Ministry of Finance, the Arab Republic of Egypt.

Lewis, Mr. Jeffrey

Jeffrey D. Lewis is Director, Economic Policy and Debt, in the World Bank's Poverty Reduction and Economic Management Network (PREM). His main roles are to provide leadership in the Bank's efforts to promote sustainable growth and poverty reduction through its operational and policy work on debt, fiscal, and shared growth policies, and to help position the Bank to shape global policy approaches to low-income country debt issues. He also heads the group that manages coordination with the IMF, collaboration with OECD, WTO, and UN economic agencies, and engagement with key shareholder groups. He previously worked as Adviser in the Office of the Chief Economist, where he provided support on areas including global trends, trade, international finance, migration, aid, and climate change; and as Manager of the International Finance team in the Development Prospects Group, which is responsible for monitoring global financial market trends and their implications for developing countries. Prior to joining the Bank in 1993, he worked at the Harvard Institute for International Development (HIID) for nine years.

Li, Ms. Yuefen

Yuefen Li is Head of the Debt and Development Finance Branch of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development. She has been working in the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) since 1990. She is also a guest professor of Tsinghua University, and at two other universities in China. Earlier she taught economics and economics related courses at the University of International Business & Economics in China. She has published books, papers and articles in professional journals and newspapers, and contributed extensively to UNCTAD publications and documents. She has lectured widely on issues related to development strategies, debt and ODA.

Hernán Lorenzino is Secretary of Finance of the Argentine Republic. Since taking office he has implemented a proactive agenda with respect to liability management, which has improved Argentina's public debt maturity profile and the perception of the country's payment willingness. This agenda has paved the way for Dr. Lorenzino to lead a new debt exchange in 2010. This transaction ended with a success, raising the exchange acceptance level above 91 per cent, which represents an important step in financial normalization of the country. Dr. Lorenzino started working in the Ministry of Economy of the Province of Buenos Aires. After fulfilling duties in different areas, he became an Advisor of the Provincial Administration of Financing Policy and Public Credit, where he gained most of his experience in financial issues. In 2003, he took office as Provincial Manager of Financing Policy and Public Credit, a post where he led the restructuring of the Province's defaulted debt. Later on, he served as Financial Representative of the Republic of Argentina in the city of Washington.

Macharia, Ms. Lilian

Lilian Macharia is Principal Resource Mobilization Officer in the Resource Mobilization Unit of the African Development Bank. She is involved in debt management and debt relief and arrears clearance issues in African Low income countries and Fragile States. She previously worked in the AfDB's Private Sector Department as an investment officer involved in supporting private sector activities in African countries through investments and technical assistance. She joined the AfDB from the NEPAD Secretariat based in Johannesburg, where she worked as a program facilitator for development partnerships involved in engagement with the G8 and OECD as well as with bilateral donors, UN and other multilateral institutions. Ms Macharia has also held various positions in the development sector in the Eastern African region.

Manna, Mr. Michele

Michele Manna is Co-Director of Banca d'Italia and Head of its Public Debt Division, which deals with the execution of auctions in domestic Italian government securities, acts as a fiscal agent for Republic of Italy issues, and handling relations with the Ministry for the Economy and Finance for related matters. Prior to his present position he was Head of the Liquidity Risk Analysis & Management Division of Banca d'Italia (2008 – 2010), Head of the Markets Analyses Division of Banca d'Italia (2006 – 2008), Deputy Head of the Corporate Division of Banca d'Italia (2004 - 2006), Head of the Monetary Statistics / Institutions Unit in the General Directorate Statistics, ECB (2000 – 2003), Economist in the Stage Three Division of the European Monetary Institute (EMI) and then in the Monetary Policy Directorate of the ECB (1997 – 2000).

Martin, Dr. Matthew

Matthew Martin is director of Debt Relief International and Development Finance International, both non-profit organisations which build developing countries' capacities to design and implement strategies for managing external and domestic debt, and external official and private development financing. Previously he worked at the Overseas Development Institute in London, the International Development Centre in Oxford, and the World Bank, and as a consultant to many donors, African governments, international organisations and NGOs. He has co-authored books and articles on debt and development financing.

Mendiola, Mr. Eduardo S.

Eduardo S. Mendiola is Deputy Treasurer in the Operations Subsector of the Bureau of the Treasury of the Philippines. In this position, he supervises and controls directly the Liability Management Service and all divisions under said services and acts as over-all coordinator of the Treasury Regional Offices of the Bureau. He also oversees the operations of the Administrative Service and all divisions under the service.

Jacob Mkandawire joined the Macroeconomic and Financial Management Institute of Eastern and Southern Africa (MEFMI) in 2007 as Programme Officer in the Debt Management Programme. Previous positions include Senior Development Advisor to the President of the Somali National Regional State; Head of the Bureau of Pastoral and Rural Development Co-ordination; Secretary General for the Somali People Democratic Party; Head of the Office of Civil Service Reform Bureau, Somali National Regional State; Head of the Office of the President and the Cabinet, Somali National Regional State, Ethiopia; and Chairman for the Parliamentary Standing Committee for Pastoral and Rural Development.

Moss, Mr. Frank

Frank Moss is Director General, International and European Relations, at the European Central Bank (Frankfurt) since 2007. Previously, he held the position of Director, General Secretariat and Language Services, at the same institution. Before joining the ECB on the date of its establishment (1 June 1998), Mr. Moss worked at the European Monetary Institute (Frankfurt, 1994-1998), the International Monetary Fund (Washington, 1990-1994), the National Bank of Belgium (Brussels, 1982-1990) and the Catholic University of Leuven (Belgium, 1980-1982).

Ngalande, Dr. Elias

Ellias E. Ngalande is the Executive Director of MEFMI (Macro economic and Management Institute of Eastern and Southern Africa). The Institute is dedicated to building human and institutional capacities of ministries of finance, of economic development and planning or equivalent, central banks and other public institutions that interface with these. He was formerly Governor of the Reserve Bank of Malawi (2000-2005) and Secretary to the Treasury in Malawi's Ministry of Finance. Dr. Ngalande was also Senior Lecturer in Economics at the University of Malawi and has experience in the private sector, having served as general manager of an investment holding company of Malawi's Agricultural Development and Marketing Corporation (ADMARC).

Panitchpakdi, Dr. Supachai

Supachai Panitchpakdi began his second four-year term as Secretary-General of UNCTAD on 1 September 2009, following his unanimous confirmation by the UN General Assembly. Dr. Supachai began his professional career at the Bank of Thailand in 1974, working in the Research Department, the International Finance Division and the Financial Institutions Supervision Department. In 1992, Dr. Supachai was appointed Senator, and that same year he became Deputy Prime Minister, entrusted with oversight of the country's economic and trade policy-making. He has published a number of books, including *Globalization and Trade in the New Millennium* (2001) and *China and WTO: Changing China, Changing World Trade* (2002, co-authored with Mark Clifford). Dr. Supachai previously served as Director-General of the World Trade Organization (September 2002 to August 2005).

Panizza, Mr. Ugo

Ugo Panizza is Chief of the Debt and Finance Analysis Unit in the Division on Globalization and Development Strategies of UNCTAD. He is also a visiting professor at the Graduate Institute, Geneva, where he teaches econometrics and development economics. Prior to joining UNCTAD, Mr. Panizza was Senior Economist in the Research Department of the Inter-American Development Bank (1998-2006).
